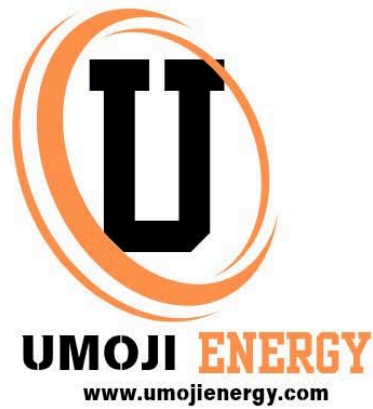
UMOJI: Transforming Lives Through Reintegration and Community Building
